INSPIRATIONAL SPEAKER AT SENIOR ASSEMBLY SHARES HOW TO MAKE THE MOST OF LIFE.

Olivia Ollerenshaw, Head Girl at East Otago High School, is an amazing young woman. She won the South Island Secondary Schools' Duathlon in 2014 and, not long after the event, was out training when she was hit by a truck and trailer with the trailer actually driving over her arm. Several surgeries and skin grafts later, she was allowed to go home so that she could spend time with her father who was dying of cancer. 11 days after arriving home, Olivia's father passed away.

Despite all of this, Olivia went on to compete in the 2015 Duathlon Champs in Oamaru, placing first with the 2nd placegetter over 3 minutes behind her.

Olivia's speech to the senior boys stressed how important it is to have determination and motivation but, more than that, she provided the boys with an option of what you can do when you are faced with adversity in life. Olivia's attitude towards her misfortune was to confront it head-on and face the challenges life threw at her. I guess we all hope that we'd do the same.
