He pulled over in the rain and waited for a car to wave down. A King's Year 12 student who must be a local to the Peninsula, pulled over. After understanding my father was lost, the student then turned around from his route home, late at night and drove in front of my father guiding him home. After figuring out he was in no condition to drive your student pulled over and took the keys from him and drove himself and my father to Maori Hill.

Barry is 78 years old and we now know isn't in a good condition to drive thanks to this boy. Upon hearing this new from my mother I just wanted to contact the school immediately to let you know of the outside of school deed one of your students from your established school did, as we don't often hear of young men willing to go to this distance to assist the ones in need.

Integrity is upholding not only in the school grounds but is spreading throughout the community. I cannot thank this student enough. Neither of my parents was able to remember his name but they said he was a local of the Peninsula (and was quite tall if that helps!) If you are able to track him down, let him know of mine and my family's gratitude. Well done and thank you. Margaret."

Well, it did take us a while but we found the "tall", Peninsula local period 5 on Thursday. He was reluctant to be in the limelight and sees nothing special about what he did. However, as Margaret's email demonstrates, knowing that there are good guys out there doing the right thing is important to all of us.

## BRONZE MEDAL FOR ASPIRING CHEFS

Think My Kitchen Rules but with more intensity. The NZ Secondary Schools' Culinary Challenge Regional event was held last weekend in Invercargill and King's duo Liam Cowie, Year 13 (below in foreground) and Tom White, Year 12 gained a Bronze medal.

The pair had to cook four servings of a main dish and four servings of an entrée in under 90 minutes while three judges scrutinized their work. Each team starts with 100 points and the judges look for reasons to take points off as the clock ticks down.

This year the competitors had to use Beetroot in their entrée. Their main dish needed to include a Chicken Supreme (a chicken breast with bone-in) and three New Zealand grown vegetables including potato.

Tom and Liam prepared as an entrée: Stained Smoked Salmon with Fresh Pickled Beetroot, Walnuts and Crème Fraiche.

While for their main they created: Mahogany Glazed Chicken Supreme with Carrot and Parsnip Puree, Braised Red Onions and Hasselback Agria Potatoes.

To gain a bronze medal, regardless of your team placing, you have to score better than 70 points.

The boys used every minute available in getting their dishes to the judges' table and both enjoyed the 'buzz' of competition. Planning for next year's competition in Cromwell is already underway.
