<u>Facts about Fiji:</u> There approximately 300 dialects specific to communities in the Fiji Islands. Fiji is also home to Rotumans (Rotuma islands), Tuvaluans (Kioa islands) and Kiribati - Banaba's islands(Rabi Island). These communities are both Polynesian and Micronesian. 54% of the population are indigenous Fijian and 34% are Indo Fijians.
