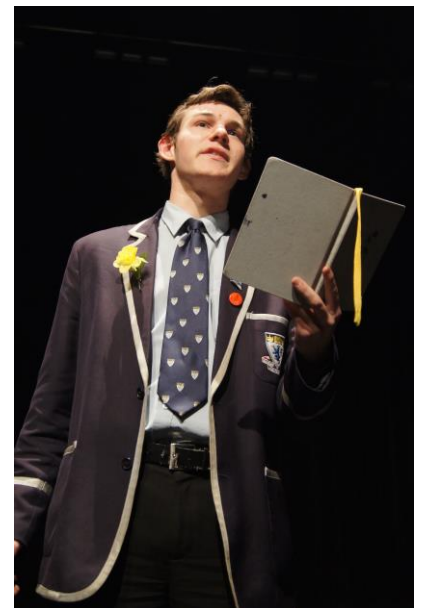

Last week, during Winter Tournament week, I had the pleasure of taking the U15 Rugby Tournament team to Christchurch to participate in our traditional South Island U15 Invitational Tournament. This tournament along with King's consisted of seven other traditional boys' rugby schools in the South Island.

Our Pool games were hosted by Shirley BHS, and all games were played on their 1st XV ground at the school. On Day 1 the boys played probably the oldest rugby school in the country, Nelson College. We started well and raced out to a 14-0 lead but we failed to capitalize on our opportunities and let Nelson back in the match. The boys fought hard and held onto a 21-17 lead with five minutes to go before Nelson eventually scored the match winner to win 22-21. A disappointing result, one which should have definitely gone our way.

On day 2 we took on Timaru BHS who had also lost on Day 1. We started extremely poorly and before we knew it we were down 17-0! Conditions did not suit us with a lot of drizzle and wind coming in late into the second half which did not allow us to play and chase the game. Timaru were deserved winners 17-12, but yet again a game we could have easily won.

In our final Pool game we played hosts Shirley BHS who up until this point remained unbeaten. The night before, one of the Shirley player's brothers and former 1st XV players was tragically killed in a car crash; to say emotions were running high was an understatement. Following a minutes silence and in front of the entire Shirley BHS we performed an inspiring and proud Haka to our opposition, Shirley responded with the assistance of their 1st XV in the foreground – you had to be there to see it and feel it! Our boys stood their ground and I think this inspired them as we played our best half of Rugby all season racing to a 23-7 lead at the break. Shirley rallied as we knew they would and played some smart rugby pinning us in our own half and using the crowd well. Our boys defended manfully but in the last play of the game Shirley scored in the corner and kicked the winning conversion from the side line, our boys were heartbroken! This was a great game of Interschool rugby, passionate, fierce and hard. The Management team were extremely proud of the boys, they gave everything and it showed!

On the last day of the tournament we played Marlborough Boys and drew 17-17 to finish our week away. Marlborough were very physical, and had some key Y11 1st XV players who dominated the tight exchanges. The boys fought hard and all participated in a hard fought draw.
