VOLLEYBALL REPORT – BUSY TIMES AT LOCAL TOURNAMENTS.

Last weekend at the Otago Champs, two King's teams performed creditably. Of the 10 competing sides, the Yr 10 team finished 3rd. in pool play. They lost to John McGlashan, beat Bayfield, John McGlashan Year 9 and Otago Boy's White finishing 2nd in their pool. In the semi final after winning the first set they lost to Otago Boy's (eventual winners) in 3 close sets. In the 3rd/4th playoff we beat John McGlashan Year 10 finishing strongly by winning the 3rd set 25 – 7. With Mt Aspiring not travelling to the South Island's we qualify as Otago 2 and are seeded 10th. Having entered the tournament for experience the Year 9 team really stepped up to the challenge. Well beaten by the two eventual finalists – Otago Boy's Year 10 and Mt Aspiring - they had a very close game against Otago Boy's Year 9 and a pleasing win against Bayfield Year 9 to playoff for 7th/8th place.

On Wednesday both sides competed in the Dunedin Tournament. Only three teams entered the A grade, where our Year 10 side beat John MGlashan but lost twice to a very good Kavanagh team. The final was a narrow 35 – 34 loss in the 30 min game. The highlight was undoubtedly the Year 9's winning the B grade, drawing on their experience from the tough Otago Champs they beat McGlashan B easily, had a close win over Taieri Year 10 and then lost to Cromwell Year 10 in pool play. However, in the final the boys played outstandingly well reversing the previous loss and beating Cromwell comfortably 45 – 33.
