## STAFF ACKNOWLEDGED AT NATIONAL TE REO AWARD.

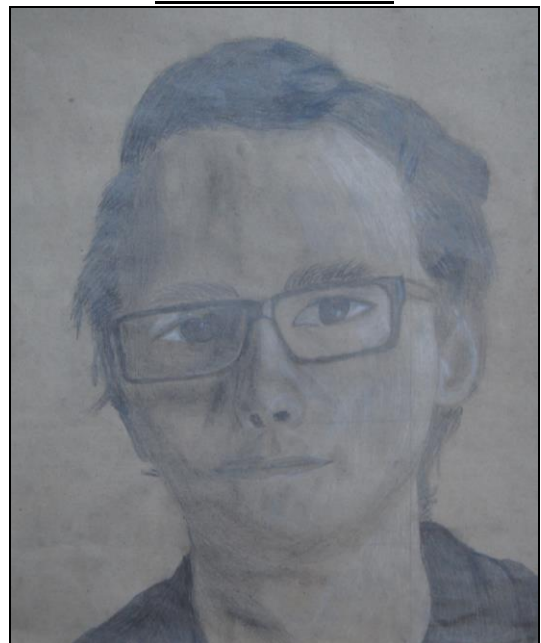
