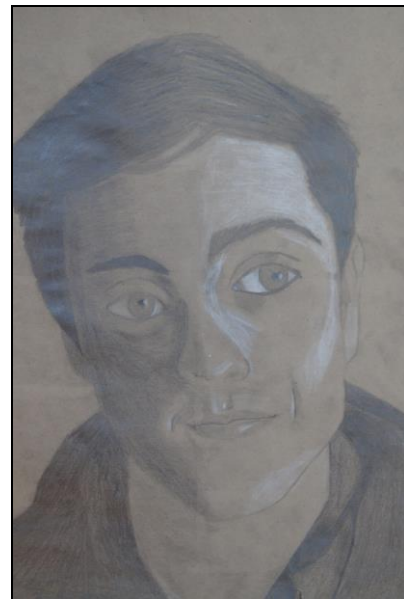
THE DEMOCRATIC PROCESS IN ACTION
