LEARNING OUTSIDE THE CLASSROOM

Over the last week, we have had two outside programmes come to King's and speak to boys about various situations and challenges that life can throw at teenagers. The Year 12s took part in the "Loves me not" programme and the Year 9, 10 and 11 students attended the "Attitude" talks (pictured below with sharks!). The "Loves me not" programme was delivered to the Year 12 students by 12 police staff. The inspiration behind the programme is Lesley Elliot, the mother of Sophie Elliot who tragically lost her life in 2008 after a relationship that had gone wrong. The theme of the day-long workshop was how to keep yourself safe in relationships. A key component of this, as explained by the police, is the role you can play as a bystander and the need to look out for your mates. Much of the first part of the workshop was focused on respecting women and what this looks like. The feedback from both King's students and staff was very positive. "Better than I expected", "I enjoyed it", "very worthwhile", "what the boys need to hear" were just some of the comments that were passed back to me. I would like to thank the police who gave up their valuable time to come to King's, and also the Maths Department who gave up their teaching spaces for the day and the Year 12 teachers who supervised throughout the day. As the first boy's school in Dunedin to partake in the programme we believe the boys will be far better off for the experience.
