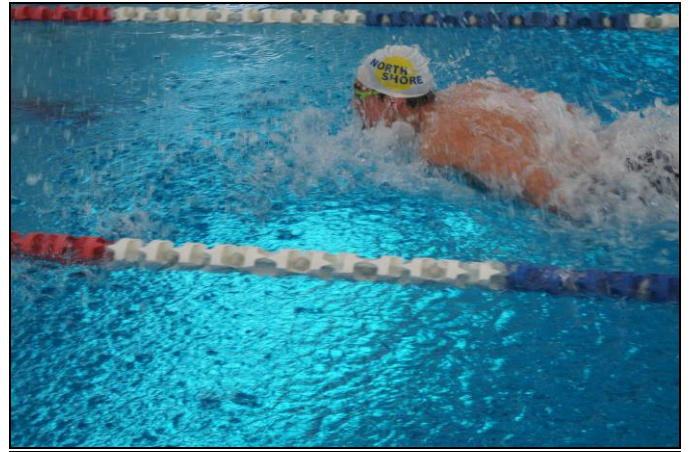


Swimming Sports Thursday 16th

PHYSICAL EDUCATION DEPARTMENT WINTER REMINDER

Physical Education Uniform:

With the onset of winter, a gentle reminder for students and parents around the expectations for Physical Education Uniform. All items are to be clean and fit for use i.e. not covered in mud from sports practices or the like.

If the PE uniform is not available, then a suitable alternative should be used, accompanied with a note outlining the reason for not having the correct uniform. Note: inappropriate clothing will not be allowed to be worn e.g. tee-shirts with inappropriate prints such as alcohol, drug prints etc.

Sports shoes are highly desirable during winter activities (school shoes may be used as an alternative to gym shoes when off campus or when the safety of the activity dictates).

Mufti Day: students are still required to wear the PE uniform - no alternative clothing is acceptable during such activities.

IMPORTANT HEALTH INFORMATION – MEASLES

PREPAREDNESS

The following information was passed onto us for our parent community from the Southern District Health Board.

You may be aware there is currently a measles outbreak in New Zealand, so far it is mainly affecting communities in the North Island.

This is a timely reminder to check your child's vaccination status and ensure that he is up to date with his vaccinations. Please let the school know if your child has not had the appropriate vaccinations to protect him from measles. You may also use this as an opportunity to review the vaccination status of your whole family.

Two MMR vaccinations provide the best protection for measles, and the vaccine is normally given at 15 months and 4 years of age. The MMR vaccine was not on the childhood immunisation schedule until 1990. That means many adults and parents may not have received the required 2 doses of MMR and are encouraged to contact their practice nurse to discuss catch-up MMR. If you are unsure, you can check with your GP or your Wellchild book for your vaccination history. Catch-up MMR is available for all children and adults who have not received their two MMR doses on today's current schedule.

If a child becomes sick with measles at our school, we may have to contemplate sending home students who are not considered immune to measles.
