## KING'S SMALL BORE SHOOTING TEAM – SECONDARY SCHOOL NATIONALS REPORT

Our 1st team had a very successful trip to the Nationals in Blenheim on the 1<sup>st</sup> of October securing 3<sup>rd</sup> place from 19 team entries from around the country, missing the silver medal by the narrowest of margins, just 0.01 of a point!

Our three man team of Nic Brosnahan, Cody Callahan and Danny Latta all started strong shooting 290.10 / 300.30 in their 1<sup>st</sup> round, just three points off the leaders, Bethlehem College from Tauranga, on 293.15. A solid 287.13 in their second round saw them four points clear of third placed Wellington Collage and five points behind Bethlehem. A solid 3<sup>rd</sup> round score of 288.11 gave our team an aggregate score of 865.34. Bethlehem College shot the same score as King's, 288.11, in their final round to secure the gold medal by 5 points. The surprise of the day came from Wellington College who shot a blistering 292.14 in their final round to finish on 865.35, just 0.01 points ahead of our King's men.

King's were the highest placed South Island team and their individual scores secured by their selection into the South Island Team in 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> positions respectively. Unfortunately the South Island was beaten by the North this year by 11 points. Individual scores for schools match and the North/South match were then added together and the top 12 scores were then selected into the New Zealand Secondary school team to shoot in a postal shoot against Great Britain. Cody Callahan shot an admirable 192.9 in his North/South card to secure his place in the NZ team.

Overall it was a very successful competition for our young men and a positive end to a very strong season.

Our King's Small bore team has been unbeaten in 18 straight Interschool and Otago Championship completions over the past five years, an impressive record that will hopefully continue into 2017!
