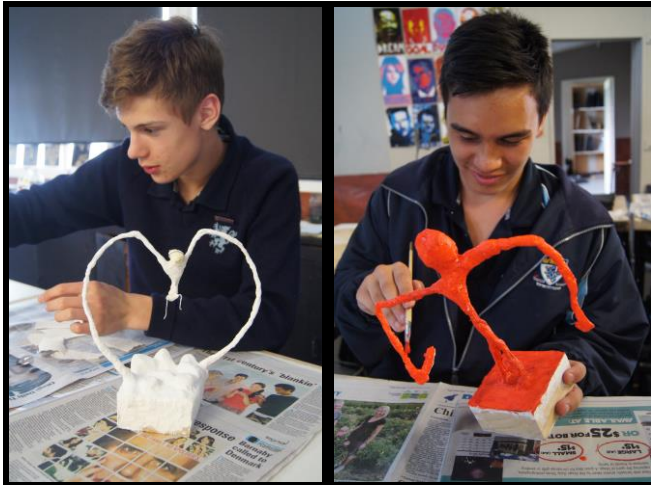

SCIENCE

9j have been testing different types of plant seed adaptations. By dropping seeds over the balcony of B Block, they found out which shape of seed structure took the longest to fall to the ground. They also looked at whether or not the seed fell straight to the ground or drifted away from where it was dropped.

We have been discussing the fact that when plants disperse their seeds, it is better if they land away from the parent plant so the competition for water and light is reduced. This then gives the seedling the opportunity to thrive.
